Building an Effective and Resilient Response to the Evolving Terrorist Threat in West Africa: Implementing the Accra Initiative

Concept Note

Context

The risk of a 'spill-over' of violent extremism and terrorism from the Sahel to the West African littoral states is a significant current and emerging trend in the global threat landscape. The Accra Initiative is an African-led initiative to address this threat. In the context of the 2023 Counter-Terrorism Week, this panel discussion will focus on efforts to build community resilience as a fundamental aspect of ensuring the effectiveness and sustainability of the Accra Initiative, including through multi-stakeholder engagement and capacity-building. In addition to the co-hosts, the panel will include interventions by representatives of the EU, Burkina Faso, Togo and Mali.

Co-hosted by the United States (one of the main international donors to the Accra Initiative), Ghana (the host of the initiative), and the Global Community Engagement and Resilience Fund (GCERF), this panel will (1) provide an updated assessment of the threat of violent extremism in West Africa, (2) integrate lessons learned from preventing violent extremism in the Sahel, (3) promote an African-led initiative through international cooperation, and (4) emphasize the role of local communities in an effective response.
