High-level Forum on Strengthening Cooperation to Enhance Terrorism Responses in Africa

Concept Note

Africa has faced a growing terrorist threat in recent years and many initiatives have been launched to address it. These initiatives contribute to international peace and security and some of them have achieved significant results in preventing and countering terrorism in Africa.

To assess local, national, regional, and international responses to terrorism, all stakeholders need to focus on sustainable measures and strategies that are context-tailored and reflect the local realities on the ground. These efforts should adopt a comprehensive approach that engages different segments of societies and aim to enhance the capacities of local, national, and regional stakeholders, including criminal justice practitioners. They should embrace preventive measures that are based on national ownership to ensure that the responses are aligned with local needs. More importantly, such efforts need to be built on strong partnerships that enable the implementation of a whole of society initiatives in the fight against terrorism.

By working together on all levels, real steps towards peace and security can be taken, protecting people from the threat of terrorism, for the Africa we want, and the one that African people deserve.
