



Humanitarian Response Plans in the Sahel and Lake Chad Basin

The UN coordinates Humanitarian Response Plans (HRPs) around the world to support national governments' and local communities' leadership in responding to crises. HRPs are the outcome of inclusive consultations that bring together national and international partners to analyse needs, develop strategies and estimate financial requirements for humanitarian action.

In the Sahel and Lake Chad Basin, six national HRPs are collectively seeking \$4.7 billion to assist 20.8 million people this year in Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Chad, Mali, Niger and Nigeria. About 570 organizations are participating in Sahel and Lake Chad Basin HRPs this year – more than 60 per cent of which are national and local partners. Channelling funds to these organizations helps to maximize efficiency by ensuring donor resources support a larger, coordinated humanitarian strategy that minimizes gaps and duplications.

Highlights from the six Sahel and Lake Chad Basin HRPs are also presented in the 2024 Sahel Humanitarian Needs and Requirements Overview (HNRO).
