## O3:00 Legislation for Human Rights - The Costa Rica

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights was proclaimed in 1948 in response to the barbarity and inhumanity of WW II. Yet, 75 years since its creation, the promise of the United Nations Universal Declaration is very far from being fulfilled. The 2011 Declaration on Human Rights Education and Training, calls on member states to "implement human rights education and training, such as through its integration into school and training curricula." Very few countries have made it into a reality except Costa Rica that passed a legislation in 2021 mandating human rights education in schools, and thus leading the way in making human rights part of the nations' fabric.
