I. Context

Every year, the organized constituency of local and regional governments, gathered in the Global Taskforce of Local and Regional Governments (GTF), engages in numerous initiatives highlighting how the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development remains a daily priority for Mayors and Governors around the world.

In support of multilevel and inclusive governance, the Global Taskforce of Local and Regional Governments is proposing to hold a World Assembly of Local and Regional Governments on Thursday 19 September 2024, ahead of the 2024 Summit of the Future. The objective of this self-organized session is to rally the presence of local and regional governments at the Summit, to present the outcomes of the UN Secretary-General's Advisory Group's on LRGs, and to elevate the political commitment of the local and regional government constituency in relation to the outcomes of the Summit of the Future.

The message from this session supports the SG's Our Common Agenda on networked multilateral strategies that reinforce the UN's central role in the system, ensuring a strong foundation fit for purpose with active participation from global, local, and regional leaders. The session will also contribute to actionable strategies within local and regional competencies, across the Action Day themes relating to digital, peaceful, and sustainable futures. The Global Taskforce's session will be supported by United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG), along with UN-Habitat, and other members of the Local 2030 Coalition.

Goals of the session

- o This Assembly, convened by the Global Taskforce of Local and Regional Governments, will gather local and regional government leaders, with national governments from around the world to discuss and inform of their contributions to the "Our Common Agenda" and the outcomes of the SG's Advisory Group on LRGs.
- o The World Assembly will elevate political commitment by mayors and governors, including the members of the Advisory Group, and expand this commitment to all representatives of the Global Taskforce. This will ensure a united front in maintaining momentum at the local level for the "Our Common Agenda" and future agreements.
